Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §1980, sub-§2-B, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 698, §2, is amended to read:

B. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a photograph, micro-photograph, videotape or other recorded image identifying a patron of the turnpike or any log or other record identifying the travel patterns of a patron of the turnpike, whether prepared for enforcement of authority tolls or other purposes of the authority is for the exclusive use of the authority in the discharge of its duties under this section. ~~The material~~ and is not available to the public ~~and, except.~~ Except as provided in this subsection or as may be necessary to prove a claim for indemnification under subsection 2-A, paragraph H, material described in this paragraph may not be used in a court in an action or proceeding.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to clarify the extent of privacy rights of motorists on the Maine Turnpike.
