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Re it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §3837, as amended by PL 1989, c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

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Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a renter in a boarding home who has rented the same premises for more than 60 consecutive days acquires the status of a tenant at will under the law and must be accorded the same notice and all other rights of a tenant at will.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill accords the legal status of tenant at will to a resident of a boarding home who rents the same premises for more than 60 consecutive days.
