26	FISCAL NOTE
28	The shorter hunting season may reduce the number of licenses sold. The resulting reductions of General Fund revenue collected
30	by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife can not be determined at this time.
32	This bill also may result in a net increase of Class E crime
34	violations. If net additional jail sentences are imposed, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$83.22 per
36	day for each offender. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may result in a jail
38	sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

42	The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial
44	Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.

50	This is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The amendment adds a fiscal
