Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1305, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1993, c. 372, §2, is further amended to read:

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Failure to approve a budget. If the budget or a portion 6 3. of the budget fails to receive a majority vote at the referendum, the board of directors shall deeide--in--a--public--proceeding 8 whether-subsequent-wetes conduct a maximum of 2 subsequent votes by referendum on the portion of the budget that was defeated. 10 The 1st and 2nd subsequent referenda must be conducted in 12 accordance with the referendum procedure in subsection 2 er-at-a district-budget-meeting-held-at-a-single-place-in-the-district-in accordance-with-procedures-in-sections-1303-and-1304---Subsequent 14 votes-conducted-in-accordance-with-the-referendum-procedure-in subsection-2 and must be held within 45 days. 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Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA §1353, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

4. Failure to approve budget. If the board of directors declares that an article has not passed pursuant to subsection 3, 2 paragraph D, it shall follow the procedures in sections 1305 and 1308 until an operating budget has been established. 4 б STATEMENT OF FACT 8 This bill requires that, if an article or several articles of a school district budget fail to pass in an initial 10 referendum, a maximum of 2 subsequent referenda may be held to establish the budget. If no budget has been passed after the 3rd 12 referendum, the previous year's operating budget becomes the

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approved budget.
