	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §6303 is enacted to read:
4	§6303. Medicaid for health and human services
6 8	<u>A school administrative unit may receive funds from the Medicaid program pursuant to the United States Social Security</u>
10	Act, 42 United States Code, for the provision of health and human services to eligible students in accordance with section 15613,
12	subsection 16. No less than 70% of the savings that result from receipt of Medicaid funds must be used to provide health and human services to eligible students. For purposes of this
14	section, the total amount of Medicaid funds received by a school administrative unit is considered savings.
16	Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §15613, sub-§16 is enacted to read:

20	16. Medicaid. The state share of the foundation allocation may not be adjusted for a school administrative unit that receives Medicaid funds for the provision of health and human

46	This bill permits a school administrative unit to receive Medicaid funds for the provision of health and human services to
48	students without a subsequent reduction in general purpose aid by the State provided that the school administrative unit expends at

for a General Fund appropriation of \$50,000 to the Department of Education to provide technical assistance to school
administrative units seeking Medicaid reimbursement.
