	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §3906-A, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 779,
4	§8, is repealed.

10	1. Establishment. There is established within the department a program to promote the spaying and neutering of
12	domestic pets by contracting with local animal shelters and making grants to those shelters as provided in this section.

16	2. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the
18	following meanings.
20	A. "Domestic pets" means cats and dogs.
22	<u>B. "Fund" means the Spaying and Neutering Fund established</u> in this section.
24	C. "Participating veterinarian" means a veterinarian licensed under Title 32, chapter 71-A who agrees to
26	participate in the program.
28	D. "Presurgical immunization" means presurgical immunization for dogs against rabies, distemper, hepatitis,
30	<u>leptospirosis and parvovirus or for cats against rabies,</u> feline panleukopenia, calici, pneumonitis and
32	rhinotracheitis on animals not previously immunized.
34	E. "Program" means the spaying and neutering program established in this section.
36	3. Fund. The Spaying and Neutering Fund is established for
38	the purpose of carrying out this section. The fund receives the amounts collected from the additional 2% tax on pet food and pet
40	supplies pursuant to Title 36, section 1811 and other funds from any private or public source to subsidize spaying and neutering.
42	The money in the fund must be used for grants and administrative expenses relating to the spaying and neutering program
44	established in this section. Amounts in the fund do not lapse but are carried forward.
46	4. Certification. The department shall certify animal
48	shelters that are eligible to receive grants under this section. The animal shelter must be licensed and must agree to follow

rules established by the department for the administration of the program.

5. Grants. The department shall make grants to certified 4 animal shelters to promote spaying and neutering of domestic pets. 6 6. Vouchers. Animal shelters receiving grants under this section shall provide vouchers to persons who agree to have 8 domestic animal, spayed or neutered. A voucher may be granted 10 for any domestic animal whether or not the domestic animal has been under the care of the shelter. The vouchers must authorize payment to a participating veterinarian of the authorized cost of 12 spaying or neutering. When granting a voucher, the shelter shall also provide the recipient with a list of local participating 14 veterinarians. The veterinarian may submit the voucher and 16 certification that the animal has been spayed or neutered to the department, which shall promptly make payment of the authorized cost to the veterinarian. 18 7. Authorized costs. The department shall adopt by rule 20 authorized costs of spaying, neutering and presurgical immunization. 22 24 8. Immunizations. The program must also provide vouchers for presurgical immunization. 26 Sec. 3. 36 MRSA §1752, sub§-8-B is enacted to read: 28 8-B. Pet supplies. "Pet supplies" means a product, 30 including food, that is ordinarily intended for use by or for a cat or dog. 32 Sec. 4. 36 MRSA §1811, as amended by PL 1993, c. 701, §§6 and 7 and affected by \$10, is further amended by adding at the end a 34 new paragraph to read: 36 An additional tax of 2% is imposed on the sale of pet 38 supplies. The amounts collected under this additional 2% tax must be deposited in the Spaying and Neutering Fund created in Title 7, section 3906-D. 40 42 Sec. 5. Transition. Any amounts in the Spaying and Neutering Fund formerly created in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 7, section 3906-A, subsection 3 must be transferred to the Spaying 44 and Neutering Fund established by this Act. 46

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes a program to increase the spaying and neutering of domestic pets through a voucher system administered by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources through local animal shelters. The cost of the program is funded by an additional 2% sales tax on pet supplies.
