### An Act to Provide Funding for Homeless Students.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

#### Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §15613, sub-§16 is enacted to read:

16. Tuition for homeless students. Beginning with school year 1996-97, each school administrative unit or private school 6 approved for tuition purposes is quaranteed an amount equal to the approved tuition rate for the school unit or private school 8 for each homeless student in attendance, prorated by the amount 10 of time in attendance. Payment must be made during the year of attendance. The commissioner shall provide funding by reducing the state share of the total allocation for operating costs by 12 the amount required to provide this funding and increasing the local share of the total allocation for operating costs by the 14 same amount. The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this 16 subsection.

18 The department shall create a nonlapsing, interest-earning, revolving fund to carry out the purposes of this subsection. Any 20 unexpended balance in the fund may not lapse but must be carried forward. Money allocated to this fund and interest earned on 22 unexpended funds must be used for the purposes of this subsection.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires the State to provide funding for a 28 homeless student's education costs and establishes the reimbursement rate as the tuition rate at the school as prorated by the amount of time in attendance for each student. 30 This bill also directs the Department of Education to establish а nonlapsing, interest-earning revolving fund to finance homeless 32 students' education costs. Funding must be accomplished by reducing the state share of the total allocation for operating 34 costs statewide and increasing the local share of the total allocation for operating costs statewide by an amount equal to 36 the cost of educating all Maine homeless students.
