	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6446 is enacted to read:
S	6446. Abandoned lobster traps; removal
	The owner of a lobster trap left on another person's roperty without that person's permission is liable for all costs not
	1. Notification. The property owner notifies the trap wner in writing that the trap must be removed. Notification nder this subsection must:
	A. Be sent by the property owner to the trap owner not later than 15 days before the trap becomes an abandoned trap; and
	B. Indicate where the trap is located and the date on which that trap will become an abandoned trap; and
	2. Failure to remove. The owner of the trap fails to emove the trap prior to the date on which the trap becomes an bandoned trap.
<u>h</u>	For the purposes of this section, the term "abandoned trap" as the same meaning as in Title 17, section 2263, subsection 1-E.
	Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §2263, sub-§1-E is enacted to read:
	1-E. Abandoned lobster trap. "Abandoned lobster trap" eans a lobster trap left for more than 90 days on another erson's property without that person's permission.
§	Sec. 3. 17 MRSA §2263, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1993, c. 144, 4, is further amended to read:
b	2. Litter. "Litter" means all waste materials including, ut not limited to, bottles, glass, crockery, cans, scrap metal,
j	unk, paper, garbage, rubbish, offal, feathers, except feathers rom live birds while being transported, abandoned ice-fishing
s	hacks, <u>abandoned lobster traps,</u> old automobiles or parts of utomobiles or similar refuse, or disposable packages or
	ontainers thrown or deposited as prohibited in this chapter, but ot including the wastes of the primary processes of mining,
	ogging, sawmilling, farming or manufacturing.

STATEMENT OF FACT

4	This bill defines an "abandoned lobster trap" as a trap left
	for more than 90 days on another person's property without that
6	person's permission. The owner of the abandoned trap is liable
	for the costs incurred by the property owner to remove the trap
8	if the trap owner fails, after written notification, to remove
	the trap prior to the time it becomes an abandoned trap.
