An Act to Establish an Emissions Reduction Credit Trading Program.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §608-B is enacted to read:

<u>§608-B. Emissions reduction credit trading program</u>

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The department shall adopt rules, in accordance with Title 5, chapter 375, establishing an emissions reduction credit trading program that addresses the offset requirements for new major sources and major modifications of nonattainment pollutants as set forth in Part D of the federal Clean Air Act, 42 United States Code, Section 7501 et seq. The department's program must provide sources in the State with the maximum ability and flexibility to create, preserve and use emission reduction credits for offsets allowed under the federal Clean Air Act and the United States Environmental Protection Agency rules.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Under the federal Clean Air Act, a company that proposes to site a major new source or expand an existing source in an ozone nonattainment area must obtain offsets of volatile organic compounds and nitrogen oxide. Offsets are reductions in existing emissions from either the plant being expanded or another plant in the area. Because this State is part of the ozone transport region, this offset requirement applies statewide.

The purpose of this bill is to maximize the ability of this State to continue to attract capital investment into the State. This bill directs the Department of Environmental Protection to develop rules that provide sources in the State with the maximum ability and flexibility to create, preserve and use emission reduction credits for offsets as allowed under federal law.
