Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7463-A, sub-§2-A, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 206, §4 and affected by §7, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

2-A. Number of permits. For the purpose of maintaining moose populations in balance with available habitat in districts and zones established under subsection 1-A, the commissioner may issue moose hunting permits. The commissioner shall determine the number, sex and age of moose to be taken from each district and zone and issue permits in accordance with this determination.

STATEMENT OF FACT

18 Currently, the number of moose hunting permits is established by law. This bill repeals that law and allows the 20 Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to set the number of permits issued based upon the intent of maintaining a balance 22 between moose populations and the available habitat.
