### Sec. 3. 29-A MRSA §2052, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7. Backing. An operator may not drive a vehicle in reverse or back a vehicle on a limited-access way or on an entrance or exit of a limited-access way.'

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

#### 'FISCAL NOTE

This bill establishes a new traffic infraction. The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.

The additional enforcement costs associated with this new traffic infraction can be absorbed by the Bureau of State Police within the Department of Public Safety utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment allows a law enforcement officer to issue a permit to operate a vehicle when the registration has been expired for more than 30 days. The permit is valid for operating the vehicle to the owner's residence or to an office of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles to register the vehicle. This amendment also prohibits backing a motor vehicle on a limited access highway.
