Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §1301 is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§1301. Local residents preferred

- 8 1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
 - A. "In-state bidder" means a bidder:
 - (1) Whose principal place of business or a branch of the bidder's principal place of business has been located in the State for a period of at least 2 years; and
 - (2) Who will employ at least 90% state residents to perform the conditions of the contract.
 - 2. Preference: exceptions. The State, a county, city or town, and every charitable or educational institution that is supported in whole or in part by aid granted by the State or by any municipality shall, in the awarding of a contract for constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing or equipping its buildings or public works, give preference to an in-state bidder, provided the bid submitted by the in-state bidder is no more than 5% over a bid submitted by a bidder from outside the State. This section does not apply to construction or repairs amounting to less than \$1,000 or to emergency work or state road work. The preference in this section applies to contracts involving funds obtained from the Federal Government unless expressly prohibited by the laws of the United States or regulations adopted pursuant to those laws.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill gives preference in the award of construction and public works contracts by the State and its political subdivisions to in-state bidders, provided their bids are no more than 5% over bids submitted by out-of-state bidders. The bill defines "in-state bidder" as a bidder whose principal place of business or a branch of the bidder's principal place of business has been located in the State for a period of at least 2 years and who will employ at least 90% Maine residents to perform the conditions of the contract.
