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1. Membership. The Joint Practice Council on Advanced Practice Registered Nursing, referred to in this subchapter as the "council," consists of 6 members as follows: the chair of the State Board of Nursing, one member of the State Board of Nursing who is approved to practice as an advanced practice registered nurse, the chair of the Board of Licensure in Medicine, the chair of the Board of Osteopathic Licensure, the chair of the Board of Commissioners of the Profession of Pharmacy and one member of the public appointed by the Governor.

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2. Chair. The council chair rotates annually among the chairs of the respective boards. The chair of the State Board of Nursing serves as the first chair of the council; the chair of the Board of Licensure in Medicine serves as the 2nd chair; the Chair of the Board of Osteopathic Licensure serves as the 3rd chair; and the chair of the Board of Commissioners of the Profession of Pharmacy serves as the 4th chair. The term of the public member is 4 years.

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3. Duties. The council shall make recommendations to the State Board of Nursing regarding the prescription of drugs and devices by advanced practice registered nurses. The council may make other recommendations regarding the practice of advanced practice registered nursing as it considers appropriate.

Sec. 10. Transition provision. Notwithstanding the Maine

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The duties of the council are advisory in nature.

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Revised Statutes, Title 32, section 2152, an advanced practice registered nurse must be appointed to the next vacancy for appointment or reappointment of a public member to the State Board of Nursing. The next vacancy for appointment or reappointment of a licensed practical nurse after the appointment

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reappointment of a licensed practical nurse after the appointment of the advanced practice registered nurse must be filled by the appointment of a public member.

38 40 Sec. 11. Effective date. That section of this Act that repeals the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, section 2102, subsection 2, paragraph B and those sections that enact Title 32, section 2102, subsections 2-A and 5-A, section 2201-A and section 2205-B take effect January 1, 1996.'

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Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

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'FISCAL NOTE

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The State Board of Nursing will incur some minor additional costs to adopt rules pertaining to advanced practice registered

nurses, to administer certain requirements and to pay for its share of the costs of the Joint Practice Council on Advanced Practice Registered Nursing. These costs can be absorbed within the board's existing budgeted resources.

In addition, the Board of Licensure in Medicine, the Board of Commissioners of the Profession of Pharmacy and the Board of Osteopathic Licensure will incur some minor additional costs to participate on the Joint Practice Council on Advanced Practice Registered Nursing. These costs can be absorbed within the boards' existing budgeted resources.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development. The minority report is also "ought to pass as amended."

This amendment creates the category of advanced practice registered nurse, whose scope of practice is to be defined by the State Board of Nursing. Included in the category are certified nurse practitioners, certified nurse midwives, clinical nurse specialists and certified nurse anesthetists. Qualifications for this position include a formal education program in the practitioner's specialty and certification in advanced nursing by the appropriate national body. Certified nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives may prescribe and dispense drugs according to board rules.

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Certified nurse midwives and certified nurse practitioners approved as advanced practice registered nurses may practice, if they desire, under the provision of the current law that allows the performance of certain functions if delegated by a physician. A registered nurse who was approved by the board for the performance of these same functions at the time of the effective date of this bill is considered to have met the quidelines for a nurse in advanced practice.

A joint practice council is established to make recommendations to the State Board of Nursing concerning the prescription of drugs and any other aspect of advanced practice nursing.

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This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
