	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 14 MRSA §159-C is enacted to read:
4	§159-C. Limited liability for farm pick-your-own operations

8	1. Limited liability. An owner, operator or employee of a farm who allows any person to enter the farm for the purpose of agricultural harvesting, including the cutting of Christmas
10	trees, under a pick-your-own agreement is not liable for injuries or death to persons or damage to property, resulting from the
12	conduct of the pick-your-own operation in the absence of willful, wanton or reckless conduct on the part of the owner, operator or
14	<pre>employee.</pre>
16	2. Notice required. The limitation of liability provided in subsection 1 applies only if the owner or operator of the farm
18	<pre>posts and maintains signs that contain a warning notice that states:</pre>

	Under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 14, section
24	159-C, the owner, operator or any employees of this farm are not liable for injury or death of persons or damage to

32	The signs must be placed in a visible place at each location where persons are allowed to enter the farm for the purpose of
34	agricultural harvesting. The warning notice must appear on a sign in black letters and each letter must be a minimum of one
36	inch in height.
38	STATEMENT OF FACT
40	This bill limits the liability of farm pick-your-own operations. Owners, operators or employees of those operations
42	will not be liable for injury, death or damage to property unless they engage in willful, wanton or reckless conduct. Signs must

be posted at each location where persons may enter the farm for

pick-your-own harvesting.
