Be i	t ·	enacted	by	the	Peo	ple o	f the	State	of	Maine	as	follows:

Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §452, as amended by PL 1991, c. 478, is further amended to read:

§452. Patrol

The sheriff in each county, in person or by the sheriff's deputies, to the extent the sheriff undertakes to patrol, shall patrol those areas in the county that have no local or other equivalent law enforcement services but may not be required by law to patrol the entire county. The county commissioners, with the sheriff's agreement, may enter into a contract with a municipality under section 107 to provide specific patrol services by the sheriff's department in return for payment for these services.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to limit the county sheriffs' patrol obligations to only those areas not otherwise served by a law enforcement agency.
