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From the effective date of this Act until June 30, 1996 the Department of Human Services must provide reimbursement for the inpatient hospice program known as Clover Hospice if it meets all of the requirements of the Medicare program except for the requirement that inpatient services be offset with a specified level of in-home services. Beginning July 1, 1996 the rules and principles of reimbursement through Medicaid must be consistent with the requirements of the Medicare program as long as reasonable and adequate inpatient hospice services for hospice patients that are Medicaid eligible but not Medicare eligible will be reimbursed under the Medicaid program or any successor program.

20	and meet Medicare requirements. It requires the Department of Human Services to adopt rules for the operation of inpatient
22	hospice programs and principles of reimbursement for inpatient hospice services within 60 days of the effective date of this
24	amendment. The department shall reimburse for inpatient hospice services effective 30 days after adoption of the rules. From the
