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	STATEMENT OF FACT
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	This bill requires an entity offering to provide an
30	Alzheimer special care program, such as a nursing home, a
	boarding care facility, an adult day care facility or a hospice
32	program, to disclose to the Department of Human Services a
	special form of care or treatment offered in order to protect
34	consumers of those programs.

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
