34	STATEMENT OF FACT
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	This bill corrects an oversight. The original approval for
38	employee assistance programs was carried out by the Office of Alcohol and Drug Abuse. When the Office of Alcohol and Drug
40	Abuse became the Office of Substance Abuse this responsibility was not transferred. The Office of Substance Abuse has continued
42	to perform the function and this bill legitimizes the present situation.
