Presented by Senator GOLDTHWAIT of Hancock. Cosponsored by Representatives: BIGL of Bucksport, CLOUTIER of South Portland, RICE of South Bristol. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Legislature has established the authority for municipalities to lease areas of the intertidal zone for the purpose of shellfish aquaculture; and

Whereas, sea vegetable farming is an important sector of the 10 State's marine resources industry; and

12 Whereas, the State's sea vegetable industry has received federal assistance to raise sea vegetables in the intertidal 20ne; and

16 Whereas, it is necessary to begin activities by June in order to take full advantage of federal assistance; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6673, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, \$5, is amended to read:

A municipality,--which that has established a shellfish conservation program as provided under section 6671, may lease
areas in the intertidal zone to the extreme low water mark, within the municipality for the purpose of shellfish or sea
vegetable aquaculture.

36 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6673, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, §5, is amended to read:

 Municipal procedure. A written application may be approved by the municipal officers if they find that it conforms to the shellfish <u>and sea vegetable</u> program, that it will not cause the total area under lease to exceed 1/4 of all the municipal intertidal zone that is open to the taking of shellfish <u>and sea vegetables</u> and that granting it is in the best interests of the municipality. On approval, the lease shall must be forwarded to the commissioner.

48 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.
