Resolve, to Establish the Commission to Study Certain Provisions Regarding Medicaid and Aid to Families with Dependent Children during Catastrophic Illness and Economic Hardship.

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission
to Study Certain Provisions Regarding Medicaid and Aid to
Families with Dependent Children during Catastrophic Illness and
Economic Hardship, referred to in this resolve as the
"commission," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following members: Two members of the Senate who serve on 8 the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources, appointed by the 10 President of the Senate; 3 members of the House of Representatives who serve on the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources, appointed by the Speaker of the House of 12 Representatives; the Commissioner of Human Services or the 14 commissioner's designee; and one advocate for individuals receiving Medicaid and Aid to Families with Dependent Children; and be it further 16

18 Sec. 3. Appointments. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this 20 resolve. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting of the commission within 14 days after all 22 appointments are made. The commission shall elect from among the members a chair; and be it further

Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall examine the current needs and assets criteria concerning Medicaid and Aid to Families with Dependent Children to determine if changes or improvements are needed to provide for working families during catastrophic illness or economic hardship; and be it further

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Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services provides research, clerical and computer assistance to the commission; and be it further

Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the commission members
who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section
2, for each day's attendance at meetings of the commission. All members of the commission are entitled to reimbursement for
travel and other necessary expenses upon application to the Legislative Council. The Executive Director of the Legislative
Council shall administer the commission's budget; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit a report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the First Regular Session of the 118th Legislature by December 15, 1996.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

4 This resolve establishes the Commission to Study Certain Provisions Regarding Medicaid and Aid to Families with Dependent 6 Children during Certain Catastrophic Illness and Economic Hardship. The commission shall examine the current needs and 8 assests criteria for recipients of Medicaid and Aid to Families with Dependent Children to determine if changes or improvements 10 are needed to provide for working families during catastrophic illness or economic hardship.

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
