Sec. 1. 37-B MRSA  $\S607$ , as amended by PL 1983, c. 594,  $\S32$ , is further amended to read:

#### §607. Admission

8 Veterans d

Veterans desiring admission to the home shall apply on forms prescribed by the administrator. Admission shall may be granted by the administrator only to veterans who-were-residents-of-Maine at-the-time-of-their-entry-into-the-United-States-Armed-Forces-or who-are-residents-of-Maine at-the-time-of-application, and to the spouses, widows or widowers of eligible veterans, provided that suitable facilities are available. Admission shall must be granted when provisions of the rules are met, when there is a vacancy and in order of application, unless otherwise provided in the rules.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill repeals the requirement that a veteran seeking admission to a Maine Veterans' Home must be a Maine resident.
