2 The Department of Education will incur some minor additional costs to process additional recertification requests. costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted 4 resources.' 6 STATEMENT OF FACT 8 This amendment allows teachers with professional certificates that have lapsed more than 5 years or with 10 provisional certificates issued prior to July 1, 1988 that have lapsed more than 5 years to be granted provisional teaching 12 certificates provided they have recently completed 6 credit hours of approved study and have met entry level requirements. The 14 bill requires teachers in these 2 categories to complete 12 credit hours of approved study. 16

18 The bill repeals the requirement that teachers granted provisional certificates work with a support system. The 20 amendment retains that provision.

This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
