An Act to Reorganize the University of Maine into 2 Separate Systems.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §1-A, as amended by PL 1985, c. 779, §88, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

- Section 1-A. System established; purposes; governance. In order to provide a comprehensive and cohesive system of public higher education designed to accomplish the goals of academic excellence; cultural, geographic, economic and educational diversity; and public accessibility, the University of Maine System is established. The system consists of the following components:
- 14 <u>1. The University of Maine, a research and doctoral university, which is the land grant institution of the State and which consists of the Orono campus and the University of Maine School of Law located in Portland; and</u>
- 2. The Maine State University, offering 4-year, 2-year and limited graduate degrees and community education programs, with campuses located in Augusta, Farmington, Fort Kent, Machias, Portland and Presque Isle.
- The trustees established in section 1 shall administer the affairs of the system. As used in this Act, unless the context otherwise indicates, "university" means the University of Maine System.
- Sec. 2. P&SL 1865, c. 532, $\S 4-A$, as amended by PL 1987, c. 20, 30 $\S 3$, is amended to read:

- Sec. 3. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-B, as amended by PL 1987, c. 769, Pt. A, §§189 and 190, is further amended to read:

Section 4-B. Duties of the board of trustees, chancellor and heads of the various campuses.

1. Board of trustees: duties. The board of trustees ---in eensultation-with-the-chancellor,-shall-be is the governing, policy making and planning body of the university and in addition shall---have has responsibility, in consultation with the controller, for preparing and approving the operating and capital budgets of the university and presenting them in accordance with the direction in Title 5, section 1665, and Title 5, chapter The university budget consists of 2 elements to be prepared by the trustees. The first element is the budget for the University of Maine and the 2nd element is the combined budget for the Maine State University. It is the intent of the Legislature that any budget reductions or increases that are made by the trustees in preparing the budgets, by the Governor and State Budget Officer in revising the budget estimates and by the Legislature in enacting the budgets be shared equally by the 2 elements.

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2. Controller and staff members; duties. The chanceller controller shall work with the trustees to develop the university budget and to develop a system of cooperative purchasing for the campuses and shall exercise such powers and fulfill such responsibilities as shall—be are delegated by the board. The chanceller—may—delegate—any—of—such—powers—and—responsibilities to—such—members—of—his—staff—as—he—deems—necessary—

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3. Presidents; duties. The head-of-each-campus-shall-be President of the University of Maine and the President of the Maine State University are the chief administrative and educational efficer-thereof officers of those components of the system and shall-be are responsible for the day-te-day day-to-day operation and development of its their academic programs within the limits defined by the board of trustees and-the chanceller; and in addition, shall exercise such rights and privileges as are generally recognized in the administering of admissions, curriculum development, extra curricular programs, leng-range long-range planning within the framework of the overall university plan, and supervision of faculty and staff.

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Sec. 4. Effective date; implementation. This Act takes effect July 1, 1996. Upon passage of this Act, the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System shall conduct a review of the laws affecting the operation of the University of Maine System and shall issue a written report to the 117th Legislature no later than December 15, 1995. The report must identify provisions of statute, uncodified public law and private and special law that require amendment in order to implement this Act. The
