36 FISCAL NOTE

38 The additional costs to provide staffing assistance to the Advisory Committee on State Employee Workers' Compensation Costs 40 Management and to pay travel expenses of certain committee members can be absorbed by the Department of Administrative and 42 Financial Services utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the entire bill and changes the 48 focus of the advisory committee from workers' compensation funding issues to the State's management of its return-to-work

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and safety programs. The membership is increased from 9 to 12 2 members and experience in workplace safety and return-to-work programs is required for certain members. The first meeting must be called by September 15, 1996 and at that meeting the 4 Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of б Human Resources is required to report on the programs that the State has in place and the steps that have been taken to improve 8 the State's management of its workers' compensation costs. The advisory committee must report to the Governor and the legislative committees having jurisdiction over labor matters and 10 state and local government matters by February 1, 1997. The 12 amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
