The original bill required a series of statewide conferences on emerging trends in labor-management relations. The amendment replaces the bill with a resolve requiring the Department of Labor to work with the Bureau of Labor Education and the College of Business Administration at the University of Maine to offer, if feasible, a conference or a series of conferences on labor-management relations. The resolve requires the conferences to be funded through participant fees or grants.
