Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 26 MRSA c. 35 is enacted to read:

4 **CHAPTER 35**

6 **LABOR-MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS CONFERENCES**

8 **§2201. Labor-Management Systems Conferences**

10 Each year, the Governor shall cause to take place a series
12 of statewide conferences on labor and management systems. The
14 Governor shall require the Bureau of Labor Education and the
16 College of Business at the University of Maine to be the
18 organizers, planners, facilitators and coordinators of these
20 conferences and to ensure that maximum value is gained from the
conferences. The emphasis of the conferences must be on emerging
trends in labor-management relations. The responsible agencies
shall publicize the conferences and encourage all interest groups
to participate and attend.

22 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

24 This bill is the unanimous recommendation of the Commission
26 on the Future of Maine's Paper Industry. It is one of 4 bills
being submitted by the commission.

28 This bill requires that the Governor convene yearly a series
30 of conferences on labor-management systems and designates the
Bureau of Labor Education and the School of Business at the
32 University of Maine as the agencies responsible for putting on
the conferences. The conferences are to focus on emerging trends
in labor-management relations.
