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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

10	OTATEMENT OF FACT
18	This bill expands and details the prohibitions on political
-0	activity for classified state employees. The bill also removes
20	the restrictions on classified state employees relating to fund
	raising and political contributions on nonwork time when no
22	conflict of interest exists. The bill is intended to parallel
	federal legislation enacted in 1993 removing these restrictions
24	from most federal employees.
