2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6001, sub-§38-B is enacted to read:
4	38-B. Sea cucumber. "Sea cucumber" means an animal of the
6	genus cucumaria frondulosa.
8	Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6804 is enacted to read:
.0	§6804. Sea cucumber transportation permit
.2	1. Permit required. A person may not transport unprocessed
4	sea cucumbers less than 4 inches in length without a permit.
4	2. Inspection. The department shall inspect all containers
6	of unprocessed sea cucumbers for which a permit is requested.
.8	3. Fee. The fee for a permit to transport sea cucumbers
	under this section is \$5,000 per container.

24	This bill requires a person transporting unprocessed sea
