appropriation will depend on when the suit is filed and its outcome.

The Department of the Attorney General and the Department of Human Services can absorb the additional costs of defending this claim within existing resources. The Judicial Department can absorb the additional workload and administrative costs associated with this individual case within its existing resources. An additional filing fee will increase General Fund revenue by a minor amount.'

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment removes the authorization to sue individual past or present employees of the State and places a cap of \$75,000 on the award of damages. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
