Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 **Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §1151, first and 2nd¶¶**, as amended by PL 1991,
c. 438, §1, are further amended to read:

6 The Electricians' Examining Board, as established by Title
5, section 12004-A, subsection 13, and in this chapter called the
7 "board," consists of 7 8 members appointed by the Governor,
8 called the "appointive members," and the Commissioner of
9 Professional and Financial Regulation or a representative
10 appointed by the commissioner.

12 The 7 8 appointive members shall consist of: one master
13 electrician; one electrician who is a bona fide member from
14 organized labor classified as an inside electrician; one person
15 licensed and experienced in low-energy electronics; one
16 electrical inspector; one master electrician from the education
17 field; and one person experienced in the electrical field, all of
18 whom shall must have at least 10 years of experience in the
19 electrical field; provided that the latter 3 need not be active
20 electricians at the time of their appointment; and 2
21 representatives of the public. At the time of each appointment,
22 the State Electrical Associates may nominate 3 persons for that
23 appointment. To the extent the State Electrical Associates so
24 nominates persons otherwise qualified for appointment to the
25 board, the appointive members, other than the representatives of
26 the public, may be selected from the persons so nominated.
