22	STATEMENT OF FACT
24	The purpose of this bill is to encourage on-farm production of agricultural products by clarifying what farm activities are
26	of sufficient import to be subject to state licensing and inspection.
28	This bill clarifies the current practice of allowing on-farm
30	sales of milk, places a monthly limit on those sales before licensing and permits the farmer to let potential customers know
32	that the product is available for sale.
34	The bill also allows the manufacture of hard cheeses under existing federal guidelines.
3 6	The bill also exempts from the definition of "food
38	establishments," subject to licensing requirements, certain sales of honey, maple syrup and produce when these products are sold
10	directly to the final consumer.
