	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 <del>1</del>	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA $\S6402\text{-B}$ , as enacted by PL 1993, c. 550, $\S1$ , is amended to read:
5	§6402-B. Suspension based on 2 or more convictions of possessing short lobsters

	1. Second or subsequent offense. The conviction of the 2nd
ŀ	or subsequent offense involved possession of 3 or more lobsters

	2. Offenses after July 14, 1994. That person's first
	conviction for possession of 3 or more lobsters smaller than that
	minimum size was for an offense that occurred after July 14, 1994.
	The commissioner shall notify a license holder of a suspension
	under this section and may give that person an opportunity for a
	hearing under the provisions of subchapter I, article 1.
	Following that hearing, the commissioner may reinstate that suspended license as provided in section 6353, subsection 3.
	Unless a license is reinstated following a hearing, a suspension
	under this section is for a period of 3 years from the date of
	conviction.
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	Sec. 2. Retroactivity. Section 1 of this Act applies
	retroactively to July 14, 1994.
	Sec. 3. Hearing to be held. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised
	Statutes, Title 12, section 6402-B, the Commissioner of Marine
	Resources shall hold a hearing under the provisions of Title 12,
	chapter 617, subchapter I, article 1 for any person whose license
	was suspended under Title 12, section 6402-B between the dates of
	July 14, 1994 and the effective date of this Act.
	STATEMENT OF FACT
	This bill clarifies that the suspension of a lobster
	harvesting license for persons convicted 2 or more times of

possessing short lobsters applies only to persons whose first offense of possessing short lobsters occurred after July 14, 1994, the date the mandatory license suspension for possession of short lobsters took effect.

This bill also allows a person whose license is suspended for possession of short lobsters to request a hearing by the Commissioner of Marine Resources. Following that hearing, the commissioner may decide to reinstate the suspended license.

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This bill also directs the Commissioner of Marine Resources to hold a hearing on any license suspended under that law between the date it took effect and the effective date of this bill.
