42	The reduction in the excise tax on herring products will decrease dedicated revenue to the Maine Sardine Council by
44	\$35,051 and \$46,735 in fiscal years 1995-96 and 1996-97, respectively. These reductions in dedicated revenue will leave
46	sufficient resources available to the council to cover its budgeted expenditures for the 1996-1997 biennium.

The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

The amendment deletes an obsolete reference to the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources from the laws concerning trademarks used by the Maine Sardine Council.

The amendment also adds a definition of the term "other canned herring product" to the sardine laws. It also reduces the excise tax on herring products by  $5\mathfrak{e}$ .

The amendment makes a technical change in the sardine laws to correct an error in reference.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
