Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 2 as emergencies; and 4 Whereas, this legislation permits the use of environmental registration plates on Baxter State Park Authority vehicles; and 6 Whereas, these plates need issued before 8 to be the expiration of the 90-day period; and 10 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 12 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 14 safety; now, therefore, 16 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 18 Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §517, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, 20 Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read: 22 2. Plates. The Secretary of State shall issue distinctive plates that expire at the end of a 6-year period for state plates 24 10-year period for municipal plates within and а the semipermanent plate program. Vehicles owned by the State may display a marker or insignia, approved by the Secretary of State, 26 plainly designating them as owned by the State. 28 The Secretary of State may issue environmental registration 30 plates to a state-owned vehicle assigned to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, the Department of Conservation or 32 the Baxter State Park Authority with authorization from the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, the Commissioner of Conservation or the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and 34 Wildlife in that commissioner's capacity as a member of the Baxter State Park Authority, respectively. A state-owned vehicle 36 issued environmental registration plates must display a marker or insignia designating the vehicle as state-owned and is exempt 38 from registration fees and the contribution under section 455. subsection 4. 40 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 42 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved. 44 46 STATEMENT OF FACT 48 This bill provides for the use of environmental registration plates on Baxter State Park Authority vehicles. Similar use of the plates on other state-owned vehicles is already authorized by 50

Public Law 1993, chapter 567, section 6.
