	3. Approval of costs. A municipality seeking reimbursement
16	under this section shall submit to the Commissioner of Public
	Safety an itemized list of costs of fighting fires at tire
18	disposal sites in the municipality. The commissioner shall
	determine which costs are reasonably attributable to fighting
20	fires at tire disposal sites and approve the reimbursement of
	those costs from the fund. If the money in the fund is not
22	sufficient to reimburse all approved costs, the commissioner
	shall prorate the reimbursement. Municipal costs may be approved
24	under this section for public or private tire disposal sites.
