• 0	3. Penalties. A person officiating or procuring the
50	services of an official in violation of any standard established

under subsection 2 is subject to penalties as may be determined
by the Maine Principals' Association, including without
limitation the forfeiture of any contest or contests and the
assessment of monetary fines. The Maine Principals' Association
shall promulgate a schedule of fines and provide that fines be
paid into a fund established for the purpose of the promotion and
betterment of secondary school athletics in the State.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect August 31, 1995.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill directs the Maine Principals' Association to establish standards for the provision of umpiring and refereeing services for athletic contests between secondary schools. The bill also directs the association to determine penalties for violations of these standards.
