2	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
6	Whereas, current law provides different criteria for the issuing of a hotel liquor license depending on whether the establishment is in a heavily populated area; and

10	Whereas, there are many places where large municipalities consist of varied population areas, such as a lightly populated offshore island being part of a large mainland city; and

14	Whereas, the islands of Maine are a unique and special part of the State's culture, history and economy, especially in the summer months when so much of the State's income depends on the

18	Whereas, it is necessary to support and maintain the businesses that make up the State's economy; and

22	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill amends the law on the issuing of hotel liquor licenses. Current law allows for the issuing of licenses depending on the population of the municipality the establishment is in and the number of rooms the establishment has. This bill allows hotels on islands that are part of mainland municipalities to have the island population count as a true measure of population, rather than including the mainland population.
