Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 24 MRSA §2904, as amended by PL 1989, c. 74, §1, is 4 further amended to read:

Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of any public or 8 private and special law, no licensed physician, podiatrist as 10 defined in Title 32, section 3551 or dentist as defined in Title 32, section 1081, who voluntarily, without the expectation or receipt of monetary or other compensation, provides professional 12 services within the scope of that physician's er_ podiatrist's or dentist's licensure to a nonprofit organization or to an agency 14 of the State or to members or recipients of services of that organization or state agency may be liable for damages or 16 injuries alleged to have been sustained by the person nor for damages for the death of the person when the injuries or death 18 are alleged to have occurred by reason of an act or omission in the rendering of professional services, unless it is established, 20 in the case of a physician, podiatrist or dentist in active practice, that the injuries or the death were caused willfully, 2.2 wantonly, recklessly or by gross negligence of the licensed physician er, podiatrist or dentist or, in the case of a 24 physician, podiatrist or dentist who has retired from active practice, that the physician, podiatrist or dentist retired due 26 to censure by a professional regulatory board or under an agreement with a professional regulatory board as the result of a 28 complaint or did not act in good faith. 30

STATEMENT OF FACT

34 This bill expands immunity from liability for retired physicians, podiatrists and dentists who volunteer their services 36 within the scope of their license to a nonprofit organization or an agency of the State. It also makes technical corrections to 38 reflect the intent of current law.
