	§14, is amended to read:
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10	7. License not allowed. Notwithstanding subsections 1 to 6
10	5, an individual whose license, certification or registration has been revoked or suspended in this or any other state and in this
12	or any other related field, may not be licensed under this
	section, unless the period of revocation or suspension has been
14	completed and the board has conducted a competency review and
	determined that an acceptable degree of rehabilitation has taken

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20	STATEMENT OF FACT
22	This bill clarifies the language pertaining to the criteria
	for initial or reinstatement of licensure in the State after
24	revocation or suspension in this or any other state. This bill
	also repeals the language that allowed existing counselors to
26	qualify for licensure at the time the law governing licensure for
28	counseling professionals was enacted.
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
