§1402. Duty of physicians and hospitals

All hospitals <u>and other health care facilities providing screening</u>, <u>diagnostic or therapeutic services with respect to cancer</u> shall report to the Department of Human Services all persons diagnosed as having a malignant tumor no later than 30 days from the date of diagnosis or <u>frem</u> discharge from a hospital. The report shall <u>must</u> include information on the person's usual occupation and industry of employment.

A physician, surgeon or other health care practitioner who diagnoses or provides treatment for cancer patients, upon

notification by the Department of Human Services, shall report to the department any further information requested by the

department concerning any person now or formerly under his the health care practitioner's care, diagnosed as having or having

22 had a malignant tumor. A physician, surgeon or other health care practitioner who diagnoses or provides treatment for cancer

patients is required to report any newly diagnosed cancer case to the department when that patient will not be referred to a

reporting facility for diagnosis or treatment.

STATEMENT OF FACT

34

This bill requires nonhospital health care facilities and health care practitioners to report cancer cases. The purpose of this bill is to attain complete case ascertainment and the optimal functioning of the Maine Cancer Registry.
