

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 **Sec. 1. 16 MRSA §611, sub-§4**, as amended by PL 1993, c. 719,
§5 and affected by §12, is further amended to read:

6 **4. Criminal justice agency.** "Criminal justice agency" means
8 a federal, state, district, county or local government agency or
any subunit thereof that performs the administration of criminal
10 justice under a statute or executive order, and that allocates a
substantial part of its annual budget to the administration of
12 criminal justice. Courts and the Department of the Attorney
General are considered criminal justice agencies. "Criminal
14 justice agency" also includes any equivalent agency at any level
of Canadian government.
