An Act Authorizing Seasonal Road Signs Advertising Maple Syrup.

Be it	enacted	by t	he P	ecole	of the	State	of Maine	as follows:

Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §1913-A, sub-§2, ¶F, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 387, §2, is amended to read:

F. Signs erected by growers of fresh fruit and vegetable crops advertising those fresh fruits and vegetable crops when crops are offered for sale on premises where those crops are grown from June 15th to November 1st of each year and signs erected by producers of maple syrup advertising maple syrup when maple syrup is offered for sale on premises where the maple syrup is produced from March 1st to November 1st of each year. Signs may advertise only these fruits and, vegetables and maple syrup that are available for immediate purchase. A grower or producer may not erect more than 4 signs. A sign may not exceed 8 square feet in size and must be located within 5 miles of the farm stand.

The signs must be erected on private property with the landowner's written consent, except that the signs may be erected within but at the edge of the right-of-ways of highways that receive no federal aid.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill allows producers of maple syrup to erect signs advertising maple syrup when maple syrup is offered for sale on premises where the maple syrup is produced from March 1st to November 1st of each year.
