## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment permits the harvesting of marine mollusks from areas closed to shellfishing, if the mollusks are used for bait or other uses not meant for human consumption. The harvesting must be in accordance with rules adopted by the Commissioner of Marine Resources. Those rules may not jeopardize certification of Maine's shellfish under the National Shellfish Sanitation Program. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
