COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 432, I.D. 1200

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

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FISCAL NOTE

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Establishing reciprocity procedures to determine low bidders may increase the costs of goods purchased by state departments and agencies. Since very few states continue to provide a preference to in-state bidders, the additional costs are expected to be minimal.

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The additional costs to annually publish a list of states that give preference to in-state bidders can be absorbed by the Bureau of General Services utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment replaces the original bill and directs the Director of the Bureau of General Services or any other state agency when determining the lowest bidder to add a percent increase on the bid of a nonresident bidder equal to the percent, if any, of the preference given to that bidder in the state in which the bidder resides. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
