	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
	as emergencies; and
4	Whereas contain areas of the State of the st
6	Whereas, certain areas of the State's coastal waters may be spawning areas for cod, haddock and yellowtail flounder; and
8	Whereas, populations of those groundfish species are
	severely depleted in the waters of the Gulf of Maine and the
10	Georges Banks; and

	recreational harvesters of marine organisms to conserve and
14	enhance these populations using all reasonable means; and

	during spawning make them particularly vulnerable to harvesting

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires that the Commissioner of Marine Resources adopt rules by January 1, 1996 that identify the time and location of cod, haddock and yellowtail flounder spawning in coastal waters. The bill then prohibits all commercial harvesting of marine organisms in those spawning areas during the period those species are spawning.
