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Compile, analyze and maintain information useful to the development of industry in the State concerning resources, sites, space, equipment, adequate housing, contracts, materials, transportation, markets, labor supply, population trends and other economic considerations and shall measure and monitor economic distress and poverty in the State on an en-geing ongoing basis. STATEMENT OF FACT

The amendment allows the Governor to appoint up to 6 additional public members to the Great Pond Task Force, to ensure that all interested parties are represented. The amendment also amends the duties of the task force, extends the deadline for reporting a management strategy to January 1, 1997 and specifies that the State Planning Office shall provide staffing and funding for the task force and review and update the management strategy every 5 years.

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The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
