38	STATEMENT OF FACT
40	This bill requires all persons who sell cigarettes to
	retailers to sell them at the same price to all retailers in the
42	same competitive marketplace. Those persons are required to report their prices to the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and
44	Lottery Operations. Violation of either of these provisions is a Class E crime. An aggrieved retailer may bring an action for 3
46	times the damages sustained.
