Resolve, Directing the Department of Education and the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation to Review the Continuing Education Requirements for Speech Therapists Working in the Schools.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, this legislation requires that the Department of Education and the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation submit their report no later than November 1, 1995; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Review of continuing education requirements. Resolved: 16 That the Department of Education and the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation jointly shall review the 18 continuing education requirements that are applicable to speech therapists working in schools, and shall recommend appropriate 20 changes, including altering the requisite continuing education units; and be it further

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the departments shall submit their report, including any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 117th Legislature no later than November 1, 1995.

28 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
