serve as chair. The chair shall direct the administrative and
financial matters of the authority.
5. Meetings. The chair shall call all meetings of the
board. The board shall conduct its business in public meetings
in accordance with Title 1, sections 401 to 406. A quorum of 3
members is required to conduct business and the affirmative vote
of at least 3 members of the board is required for board
actions. The board may delegate to any of its members or to the
staff of the authority any routine business that the board
determines necessary to carry out its purposes.
6. Staff. Subject to appropriation or allocation and in
accordance with the Civil Service Law, staff may be hired to

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- Notwithstanding any other provision of Title 12, the authority has the sole authority and responsibility to manage the Atlantic salmon fishery in the State, including the sole authority to introduce Atlantic salmon into Maine waters, limit or prohibit the taking of Atlantic salmon, issue licenses for the taking of Atlantic salmon and adopt rules establishing the time, place and manner of Atlantic salmon fishing in all waters of the State.  - 3. Funding. Subject to other applicable requirements of state law, receive and expend funds from any source, public or private, that the authority finds necessary to carry out its purposes. Any funds received must be placed in a nonlapsing, separate account established by the Treasurer of State, to be expended by the authority for the purposes stated in this section:
 - 4. Rules. Adopt rules necessary to manage the Atlantic salmon fishery and to promote the conservation and propagation of the Atlantic salmon. Rules adopted by the authority must be enforced by the Department of Marine Resources, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and other public officials authorized by law to enforce marine resource laws or inland fisheries and wildlife laws; and
 - 5. Property. Subject to other applicable requirements of state law, acquire, install, construct, operate, manage, sell and convey interests in real and personal property, including, without limitation, lands, dams, buildings, facilities, structures, flowage rights, mill privileges, easements and rights-of-way, as the authority finds necessary to carry out its purposes, provided that prior rights of municipalities are not affected by the requirements.

concerning each Atlantic salmon registered must be reported
accurately and truthfully.

labeled with the name and address of the person who registered
the fish, except that a person may possess a fish properly
identified under this Part.

The authority may grant an exemption from the provisions of section 6071, subsection 4, for Atlantic salmon, live or eggs, imported for the purpose of enhancing the State's Atlantic salmon fisheries.

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§9907. Atlantic salmon; limits; method of taking; closed season

Unless otherwise provided by rule adopted by the authority, a person may not:

- 1. Minimum length. Take or possess Atlantic salmon that are less than 14 inches in total length;

 by means of aquaculture.

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 922, L.D. 1298

Deallocates funds to reflect the elimination of the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission and the subsequent establishment of the Atlantic Salmon Authority.

Sec. 19. Transition provisions.

- 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, all accrued expenditures, assets, liabilities, balances or appropriations, allocations, transfers, revenues or other available funds in an account or subdivision of an account of the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission are transferred to the Atlantic Salmon Authority.
- 2. All rules adopted by the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission are deemed to be rules adopted by the Atlantic Salmon Authority and remain in effect until rescinded, revised or amended by the Atlantic Salmon Authority. Those provisions of the open water fishing rules adopted by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and those provisions of rules adopted by the Department of Marine Resources that regulate the importation or stocking of Atlantic salmon or the time, manner or location of fishing for Atlantic salmon in inland or coastal waters are deemed to be rules adopted by the Atlantic Salmon Authority and remain in effect until rescinded, revised or amended by the Atlantic Salmon Authority.
- 3. Members of the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission on the effective date of this Act are entitled to remain as members of the Atlantic Salmon Board until their successors are appointed.
- 4. The Atlantic Salmon Authority is the successor in every way to the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission.
 - 5. The Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall make all appointments required by this Act not later than 30 days after the effective date of this Act.
- 46 6. On the effective date of this Act, all position counts, appropriations and allocations to the former Atlantic Sea Run 48 Salmon Commission are transferred to the Atlantic Salmon Authority and become position counts, appropriations 50 allocations of the Atlantic Salmon Authority. On and after the

effective date of this Act, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall continue to provide the Atlantic Salmon Authority with the same level of administrative support that the department provided to the former Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission.

7. Not later than January 1, 1996, the Chair of the Atlantic Salmon Board shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The report must include the board's plan for managing the Atlantic salmon fishery in the State and any statutory recommendations pertaining to staffing or budget matters that the board determines necessary to implement that plan. The Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife may report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 117th Legislature to implement the statutory recommendations of the board.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The elimination of the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission will require General Fund deappropriations of \$82,230 and \$109,730 in fiscal years 1995-96 and 1996-97, respectively. The establishment of the Atlantic Salmon Authority will require corresponding General Fund appropriations for the biennium. Similarly, repeal of the commission will require deallocations of \$318,617 and \$426,615 from the Federal Expenditures Fund and \$17,530 and \$23,373 from Other Special Revenue Funds for fiscal years 1995-96 and 1996-97, respectively, with corresponding allocations to the authority.

 The Atlantic Salmon Authority will incur some minor additional costs to submit a required report to the Legislature which may include staffing and funding recommendations. These costs can be absorbed within the authority's existing budgeted resources. In addition, the results of this report may indicate the need for changes in authorized funding levels for the authority. Neither the types of funding nor the exact amounts can be determined at this time.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

The amendment abolishes the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission and in its place establishes the Atlantic Salmon Authority. The Atlantic Salmon Authority is governed by an 8-member board consisting of 4 public members representing various geographical regions of the State, one member from the

Passamaquoddy Tribe, one member from the Penobscot Nation, of Inland Wildlife Commissioner Fisheries and Commissioner of Marine Resources. Members may be selected from among names submitted by organizations listed as affiliates of the Atlantic Salmon Authority, the Passamaquoddy Tribe and the Penobscot Nation. All appointments are subject to confirmation Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries Wildlife. State employees may not be appointed and may not serve on the Atlantic Salmon Board.

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The amendment establishes the Atlantic Salmon Authority as the agency having sole authority over management of the Atlantic salmon fishery in the State. Authority to manage landlocked salmon remains with the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife as do all powers to regulate the importation of salmon, live or eggs, used in aquaculture, but all powers to manage or regulate the Atlantic salmon fishery previously held by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife or the Department of Resources is transferred to the Atlantic Authority. The amendment gives the Atlantic Salmon Authority the sole authority to introduce or authorize the introduction of Atlantic salmon into state waters for the purpose of enhancing the Atlantic salmon fishery, to limit or prohibit the taking of Atlantic salmon, issue licenses and to to adopt establishing the time, place and manner of Atlantic salmon fishing in inland and coastal waters. The Atlantic Salmon Authority inherits all other powers and duties held by the former Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission.

Transition provisions in the amendment require the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives to make all appointments to the Atlantic Salmon Board within 30 days after the effective date of this Act. The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is required to continue to provide administrative support to the Atlantic Salmon Authority and the authority is required to report to the Legislature in January 1996. That report must include the authority's plan for managing the State's Atlantic salmon fishery and any statutory recommendations on staffing or budget issues the authority determines necessary to implement that plan.

The amendment also adds appropriation and allocation sections that transfer the existing position counts and appropriations and allocations of the former Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission to the newly created Atlantic Salmon Authority.
