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- 5. Tags. Any Atlantic salmon taken from inland or coastal waters must be immediately tagged with a tag bearing the license number of the person who caught the fish or must be tagged as provided in section 7644, subsection 5. Five tags are issued with each Atlantic salmon license; except that only one tag is issued with a license issued under subsection 3, paragraph B, subparagraphs (2) and (3). A person may not possess, sell, give away, accept as a gift, offer for transportation or transport an Atlantic salmon that has not been lawfully tagged.
- 6. Replacement salmon; additional tags. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, the first person in a season 16 who, in cooperation with the department, presents a salmon for shipment to the President of the United States is entitled to 18 take one additional salmon, and must be issued, at no cost, one additional tag bearing that person's license number.
- 7. Atlantic salmon; possession, buying or selling. A 22 person may not possess, buy or sell an Atlantic salmon unless each fish is clearly identified by one of the following methods: 24

The person shall notify the department or its agents within 24 hours of that person's first landfall providing all information as the department may require.

### Sec. 13. Transition provisions.

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- 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Maine Revised Statues, Title 5, all accrued expenditures, assets, liabilities, balances or appropriations, allocations, transfers, revenues or other available funds in an account or subdivision of an account of the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission must be transferred to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.
- 2. All existing rules and procedures in effect, in operation or adopted by the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission with respect to the functions of the commission are hereby declared in effect and continue in effect until rescinded, revised or amended by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

3. Current members of the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission shall assume membership on the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Advisory Board until their successors are appointed.

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

24 This bill abolishes the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission and in its place establishes the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Advisory 26 Board to advise the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife matters concerning Atlantic Sea Run Salmon. 28 reassigns the Atlantic Commission's Sea Run Salmon responsibilities to the Department of Inland Fisheries and 30 Wildlife.
